RE: Letter of Reprimand

- The JAG investigation has concluded that you have engaged in several acts of verbal abuse towards public players on the 7th Cavalry Regiment COD 5 Public Server from 14 November 2009 through 31 January 2010. The investigation has verified seven instances of such abuses by chatlog records and testimony from other 7th Cavalry members, including members of the Military Police Department and officers and NCOs in your chain of command.
- 2. During this time, 14 Nov. 2009 31 Jan. 2010, you have received several verbal counseling by members of your COC, but no improvement/correction of your behavior has been observed during this time.
- 3. These offenses constituted multiple violations of several articles of the 7th Cavalry Regiment Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ). Indeed they are so serious that had the Command Staff elected to punish you under provisions of Article 15, UCMJ, you could have received a reduction in rank, 30-60 days restrictions on favorable actions, and 30-90 days of probation.
- 4. You are hereby reprimanded. Your actions have brought discredit upon yourself and have required your chain of command, going all the way up to the Regimental Commanding Officer, to seriously question your judgment and sense of responsibility.
- 5. The Command Staff will not tolerate this type of behavior from any member of this unit. Be advised, should the Command Staff be made aware of any future reoccurrence concerning this type of behavior, an immediate Article 32, UCMJ hearing will be assembled possibly resulting in your punishment under the provisions of the UCMJ or your involuntary separation from the 7th Cavalry Regiment.
- 6. This official Letter of Reprimand will be added to your permanent record and will replace any Negative Counseling Statements for all incidents that have occurred during the dates stated above.
